



2024 Ecuador and the Galápagos Islands

This summer group of excited Medina High School students along with teachers Laura Calaiacovo and Katie Shaffer headed to South America to explore Ecuador and the Galápagos Islands. The trip started in Quito where students visited Independence Plaza and the equatorial line and Intiñan Museum. The students participated in some fun, hands-on experiments to witness how natural forces work near the equator.

Flying 700 miles to the Island of Santa Cruz, the group saw giant tortoises in their natural habitat and visited the Charles Darwin Research Station. They hiked to Tortuga Bay and the beaches there. Next was Isabela Island where the kids learned about tortoise breeding and went to a pink flamingo habitat. A highlight of the trip was snorkeling in the Tintoreas Lava Islet where the students swam with seal lions, penguins, sea turtles, marine iguanas and white-tipped sharks! A rare sighting of the blue footed booby birds was a special treat. The final island was San Cristóbal where they visited the Interpretation Center and hiked Tijeretas Hill then snorkeled again with seal lions.

After flying back to Quito, the students took a day trip to Otavalo and saw a weaving demonstration and visited the market where they used their Spanish skills to barter and shop. They saw the beautiful waterfall in Cotacachi and headed back to Medina as true adventurers and a better understanding of marine life and the culture of Ecuador. It was truly a trip of a lifetime!

MHS Freshman, Sophomores, and Juniors - October 21, 2024

At Medina High School, we believe in creating as many opportunities as possible for our students to own their future. That's why we offer the PSAT/NMSQT® (Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) to our students. Whether your child is thinking about attending a two- or four-year



college, is going straight into the workforce, or isn't sure what they want to do after high school, the PSAT/NMSQT can help make their path clearer.

Results from the PSAT/NMSQT provide insights into your child's academic strengths, along with areas they can work on while still in high school. Taking the PSAT/NMSQT can also help your child to:

- Enter the <u>National Merit® Scholarship Program</u> if they meet program requirements specified in the PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide.
- See where they are and set a target for where they want to be.
- Practice and prepare for the SAT®.
- Find out what AP® courses they're ready to take.
- Plan and pay for college.
- Connect to their future career.

This fall the PSAT/NMSQT will be administered in a new digital format—followed by the SAT in spring 2024—that will provide an overall easier testing experience for students. **Your child will take the PSAT/NMSQT on October 21, 2024, using their own school-issued device.** Watch this video to see what students can expect from the digital PSAT/NMSQT. If you or your child have questions about the PSAT/NMSQT or college and career planning, please reach out to me or your child's counselor—we're here to help!

Students are able to leave school once testing is concluded, which is approximately by 10:30. Students who receive accommodations must follow the directions sent to them by their school counselor in a separate email. If students do not have a ride home, they can remain in the building for lunch and study hall until buses arrive at the end of the day.

Canada - Summer of 2024

In June a group of students from Medina High School French classes headed north to Montreal and Quebec for an amazing tour of these beautiful cities. French teacher Sarah Stevens organized the trip and teacher Laura Calaiacovo helped to chaperone. The tour started in Montreal where the students took a guided tour of Mount Royal Park, Jacques Cartier Square and the Old Port. They visited the Montreal Museum of Archaeology and History as well as the Notre Dame Basilica. Riding the tallest ferris wheel in North America, La Grande Roue, the students were able to see stunning views of the St. Lawrence River and Montreal.

After Montreal the kids headed to Quebec where they visited the Old City, Petit Champlain Street, Chateau Frontenac and Upper Town. A highlight of the trip was the historical interpretation and re-enactment of the Battle at the Plains of Abraham. A ghost tour, graffiti art activity and copper art activity were some fun, hands-on events for the students. In Quebec the students also had the opportunity to visit the majestic Montmorency Falls on the Beaupré Coast, as well as the Basilica of Sainte-Anne de Beaupré. The trip finished with a traditional dinner and maple demonstration at a Sugar Shack. The students returned with a better understanding of French-Canadian culture and improved their language skills. It was a fantastic experience!


Class of 2026 State Required Immunizations

The State of Ohio requires specific immunizations for students per this document. Currently, the State requires 12th graders to have Two doses of the meningococcal (serogroup A, C, W, and Y) vaccine. The second dose needs to be administered on or after the 16th birthday.

If you know your student has already received these vaccines, please turn in proof so we can update their record. To show proof of immunization you can either email your students clinic staff (Mrs. Jaclyn Warner, RN warnerj@medinabees.org) or have them turn it into the clinic during normal school hours. Proof of Immunization will be due at the start of the 2025-2026 school year. If you have chosen to exempt your student from these immunizations you can fill out the exemption form, Immunization Exemption Form

Dress Code

From the 2024-2025 Student Handbook:

Being ready for school includes preparing for the day by choosing proper attire that reflects a consideration of hygiene, safety and environment. The following statements are provided as guidelines to promote understanding of a few areas of concern:

- Students must wear lanyards around their neck and IDs must be attached to lanyards at all times during the school day. Exceptions occur in the classroom based on teacher discretion of student activity.
- 2. Any apparel showing suggestive or profane pictures or wording; showing alcohol, tobacco, or drug-related sayings or pictures; promoting or depicting sex, violence, or self-destructive behavior; or any item that defames the nation, state, community, or an individual will not be permitted.
- 3. Tops must cover underclothing.
- 4. Dresses, skirts, pants, shorts, or clothing showing skin must be long enough or worn to cover undergarments.
- 5. Clothing with group markings or clothing associated with a non-school group or gang will not be permitted; e.g. shirts of the same color or marking.
- 6. Any spiked jewelry or chains are not permitted in school; these items will be confiscated.
- 7. Proper safe footwear must be worn at all times in the school buildings.
- 8. Sunglasses are not to be worn in the building.
- 9. Teacher discretion is used within the classroom as it pertains to hats and hoods.
- 10. Any new "fads" in clothing, costumes or anything not specifically covered in the above guidelines which are considered inappropriate dress shall be dealt with at the discretion of an administrator or designee.
- 11. No undergarments will be showing (male or female) whether standing or sitting.
- 12. Any other clothing or accessory deemed inappropriate by administration can be a dress code violation.

If there are any questions as to the appropriateness of any type of clothing, the school should be contacted in advance. In the event inappropriate clothing is worn or displayed, it is the responsibility of the student to make arrangements to immediately remedy the situation. Students will be retained in the office until appropriate clothing is obtained or clothing may be provided by the school. Any student violating this policy will be subject to disciplinary action.

Lanyards

Lanyards with Student IDs or temporary IDs must be worn by students all day and every day. Students who accumulate five or more violations of not wearing lanyards/student ID's are subject to after school detention.

From the 2024-2025 Student Handbook:

SCHOOL IDENTIFICATION

- 1. School issued ID cards and school issued lanyards must be worn and visible at all times, during the school day.
- 2. If a student has an ID badge and/or lanyard not in compliance with rule #1, they will be sent to their appropriate office for a temporary replacement and/or to purchase a new one. Repeated violations may result in student discipline.
- 3. If a student has lost or defaced their ID card, they must get a replacement from the HUB. Cost for replacing the ID card is five dollars (\$5.00) and cost for a new lanyard is (\$2.00), and may be paid by cash or check. Failure to get a replacement card and/or lanyard will result in disciplinary action.

- 4. A student ID card should not be given to another person at any time. Violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.
- 5. Students who have lost or forgotten their ID will be sent to the office to purchase a new one.
- 6. ID cards will be necessary for computer usage, admission to school dances and other functions, and for Media Center use. Failure to have your ID card may result in the loss of privileges.
- 7. ID cards are the property of Medina High School and may NOT be defaced in any way.
- 8. Students may only possess one of their own, current ID cards. No student should possess or wear more than one ID of their own or of another student.

2024-2025 Parking Permits

All students driving to MHS must have a Parking Pass. Students may park in Lots B, C, E and F with a pass. Students *are not* to park in the lots of any of the area buildings including the rec center parking lot. 2024-2025 Parking Permits will be sold at the Hub starting in August. Full school year cost: \$40.00 with Cash or Check Payable to Medina City Schools. The Parking Pass Google form must be filled out and the cost must be paid at time of permit pick up. Reporting Student Absences

- If a student will be missing school, a parent needs to call the Attendance line. The parent will
 need to spell the student's last name, give his/her school ID#, and the reason that he/she is
 absent.
- If a parent does not call, the student will be marked "unexcused absent" and an automated call will be generated by 10:30 a.m. each morning.
- If a student is late because of an orthodontist, doctor, dentist, court appointment, etc., the absence will be excused if the student brings in a school excuse from the doctor, dentist, etc. to the Attendance Office.

If a Student Becomes III in School

Students should report to the clinic with a pass from his/her teacher. If the student walks or drives home, the nurse will call a parent/guardian to obtain permission for that student to leave the school. If the student is being picked up, the driver can pick up that student at the front entrance A-7 doors-in the vestibule by the main office. The nurse or school staff may escort the student out if necessary. As has always been our policy STUDENTS SHOULD NOT BE USING THEIR CELL PHONES TO CALL PARENTS DIRECTLY TO GO HOME ILL - We will enforce that any student leaving the school ILL MUST be excused through the clinic.

Tardiness to School

Oversleeping, car trouble, power failures, traffic problems, frozen car locks are all unexcused tardies. A note or call from a parent to the Attendance Office regarding the reason is always appreciated and will be noted for your student's records. A Principal or his/her designee shall make the final determination between excused or unexcused tardy if necessary. As the student accumulates tardies to school, the following consequences may result:

4 tardies ~ One (1) ASD, 8 tardies ~ (2) ASDs, 12 tardies ~ 2 hour Saturday school and notification

Leaving Early

Parents/guardians are to send in a note requesting their student leave early for the purpose of not attending an end of the day study hall. The note must be dated and the time that the student is to leave school. These notes should be brought to the attendance office by the student in the morning. Phoning in a request daily for a student to leave early is highly discouraged. Absences to avoid being in last period study hall are unexcused.

Planned Absences

The student needs to tell his/her teachers about the absence and make arrangements to make up the work. The parent needs to call the attendance line in advance and give the dates and reason the student will be missing school, such as vacation, surgery, etc.

Appointments

Phoning in a request for a student to leave early is discouraged, although sometimes unavoidable. Writing notes in the morning is preferred. Parents need to realize that it may take time to find the student, especially if the student is in a gym class or at lunch. Dismissal slip will then be delivered to the student. The parent does not come in to sign out the student. The student will then meet the parent outside of the building at the designated time.

Vacations

Ohio law does not specifically allow vacation travel to be considered an excused absence from school. In situations that are essentially unavoidable, schools are permitted to grant excused absences in order to travel. Medina City Schools allows up to 5 excused vacation days per year. A Request for Vacation Travel is required to be filled out and turned into the Attendance Office well in advance of the intended absence. The form can be found under Forms on the MCS website, on the MHS website, on Blackboard under the Forms tab in the MHS Student Organization and this link. Request for Vacation Travel Form

IMPORTANT NOTICE: If a student will miss more than approximately 65 hours (10 days) due to a vacation, parents/guardians are required to un-enroll their student from the Medina City Schools and re-enroll them upon return from vacation. This is done by contacting the Office of Registration at 330-636-3100. Questions concerning this procedure may be directed to Dr. Kristine Quallich, Asst. Superintendent, at 330-636-3092.

Moved or Planning a Move?

If you currently reside in the Medina City School District and have recently moved, or plan to move to a new address within the District, you will need to provide proof of residency to the Medina City School District Registration Office. One of the following documents will be accepted as proof of residency: current utility bill, mortgage contract, purchase contract, lease agreement, insurance statement on the dwelling, or a letter from your builder indicating a possession date within 90 days of enrollment in the district. If you are moving out of the district during the school year, please notify the guidance secretaries so that the withdrawal process can begin. Please be certain to promptly register in your new school district and complete a records request so that we may release educational records to the new school.

Diploma Name Verification and Commencement Participation

Seniors need to complete the Diploma Name Verification and Commencement Participation Google form. **This is due December 6, 2024**. A diploma is an official document which includes first, middle last name and suffix, if applicable. A diploma will only be issued in the name which appears on the student's birth certificate.

FAFSA - 7 Things You Need Before You Fill Out the FAFSA FORM

If you need financial aid to help you pay for college, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. Many colleges and universities also require the FAFSA to be completed to be eligible for merit based scholarships. The 2025-2026 FAFSA form will be available sometime in

December 2024. FAFSA should be filled out as soon as possible on the official government site, fafsa.gov.

It'll be easier to complete the FAFSA form if you gather what you need ahead of time. Below are 7 items you'll need to find before you start:

- 1. Your FSA ID (You and your student can apply for this NOW!)
- 2. Your Social Security number
- 3. Your driver's license number
- 4. Your latest tax records
- 5. Records of your untaxed income
- 6. Records of your assets (money)
- 7. List of school(s) you are interested in attending
